



Working with children and youth is a responsible task

- Be care- and respectful.
- Give positive attention, but have a professional educational distance. Find your own balance between closeness and distance.
- Create an atmosphere of trust through consistent interaction with children and young people. Always try to use your authority for the benefit of children and youth instead of causing harm.
- Also, keep in mind that you are strangers in a different culture and respect that.
- The privacy of children and adolescents must be respected. Therefore, always ask for consent before taking photos and videos to publish them.
- Be responsible and reliable in your work with responsible and reliable in your work with the children.
- Use appropriate language and set a positive example in your behavior (no alcohol and no smoking in the presence of children).
- Generally have a positive attitude, be joyful and well-balanced.
- Show interest and understanding for the children and local staff. Be open to their thoughts, ideas, and feelings.
- Try to support each child according to their abilities and keep in mind that you treat every child equally/do not neglect any child.
- There are rights of children! The United Nation's children's right convention of 1989 has defined the following 10 basic rights for children and youth:
 1. The right to equal treatment and protection against discrimination irrespective of race, religion, origin and sex.
 2. The right to a name and nationality.
 3. The right to health.
 4. The right to education and training.
 5. The right to leisure, play and recreation.
 6. The right to be informed, to communicate, to be heard and to assemble.
 7. The right to privacy and education in the spirit of equality and peace.
 8. The right to immediate assistance in the event of disasters and emergencies and to protection from cruelty, neglect, exploitation and persecution.
 9. The right to a family, parental care and a safe home.
 10. The right to care for people with disabilities.
